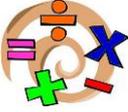


Subject	2 <sup>nd</sup> Half Term
<b>English</b> 	<b>In English we are learning to -</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Look at persuasive texts in a variety of forms including adverts, posters, leaflets and trailers</li> <li>➤ Explore traditional tales, looking at plot, setting, characters and the power of transformation and change.</li> <li>➤ Write some new scenes for a play</li> <li>➤ Write a new fairy tale.</li> </ul>
<b>Mathematics</b> 	<b>In Mathematics we are learning to-</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Use addition; subtraction; multiplication and division with measurements.</li> <li>➤ Recognise that there are different types of triangle e.g. isosceles and right-angled.</li> <li>➤ Halves and quarters of numbers and number puzzles</li> </ul>
<b>Religious Education</b> 	<b>What is fasting and why do people do it?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Learn about the practice of fasting in Islam and Christianity</li> <li>➤ Reflect on the importance of fasting for religious believers</li> </ul>
<b>Music</b> 	<b>Singing</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Developing some control of the expressive elements e.g. timbre, dynamics, tempo when singing</li> <li>➤ Recalling and remembering short songs</li> </ul>
<b>Computing</b> 	<b>Algorithms and programmes</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Learn to predict the outcomes of a set of instructions</li> <li>➤ Use different commands in programming confidently</li> </ul>
<b>Physical Education</b> 	<b>Outdoor P.E - Athletics (Track)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Compare performance of self and others and demonstrate improvement to achieve their best</li> <li>➤ Sprint over hurdles</li> <li>➤ Identify personal distance strengths</li> </ul> <b>Indoor P.E- Carnival Dance</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Perform dances using simple movement patterns</li> <li>➤ Repeat individual moves</li> <li>➤ Link a series of at least four moves</li> </ul>
<b>Topic: World of Work and Enterprise</b>	
<b>The aim of World of work and Enterprise;</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ To develop children's awareness of the world of work and work related concepts and vocabulary</li> <li>➤ To increase understanding of a variety of occupations and roles, and help prevent stereotypes around gender and cultural suitability for particular jobs</li> <li>➤ To demonstrate the links between learning in school and success in adult life</li> <li>➤ To develop children's financial capability from a young age and increase understanding of why people earn and save money</li> <li>➤ To develop children's sense of responsibility and their skills for co-operation, enterprise and problem solving</li> </ul>	
<b>Topic taught through cross- curricular links including Science (Grow It, Cook It), History, Geography, Computing (Film It), Art, Design Technology and P4C</b> 	<b>Theme- Our Community- My place in the Community</b> <b>Who has the best job in the community?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Find out about a variety of job roles within the community</li> <li>➤ Identify how different jobs benefit the community</li> <li>➤ Find out why people choose to work in community related jobs</li> <li>➤ To raise aspirations by meeting people from the world of work</li> </ul> <b>Skills</b> <b>Attitude</b> - Competitiveness, self- belief, determination, aspiration, motivation <b>Creativity</b> - Problem solving, innovation, generating ideas, spotting and creating opportunities <b>Relationships</b> - Managing difficult situations, working with others, communication, negotiation, presentation <b>Organisation</b> - Planning, goal setting, decision making, research, managing risk, managing resources
